# **Return to Social Work**



With funding from the North West Regional Improvement Plan Pilot, we launched our Return to Social Work Course in collaboration with Cheshire and Merseyside Teaching Partnership. Teaching started in April 2025 with supervised placements following from May onwards.

# 2025 Highlights:

- 36 Students
- 100% satisfied with the Course
- 100% Planning to return to Social Work position in Greater Manchester
- 80% Planning to return to Social Work position in Cheshire and Merseyside

- 10 students to date have registered with Social Work England and have secured jobs
- Remaining students in the process of completing placements/ re registering

# Return to Social Work 2026 - Funding now secured

Following the success of our 2025 cohort, we have secured funding for another cohort for 2026 and are widening our regional collaboration to include Blackpool.

- Regions included: Greater Manchester/ Cheshire and Merseyside and Blackpool.
- •45 places split between the 3 regions (15 each).
- •Teaching to commence on 9th 12th Feb 2026
- Employability day 16th June 2026
- Supervised practice placements to start from April 2026.
- •48 RTSW enquires/ contacts received since April 2025.

# **Social Work Placements**

Over the summer we began our placement planning, with 250+ final year social work placements needed across the partnership, we are on target to meet this demand thanks to our employer partners allocating placements and supporting the training of practice educators.

Placement Feedback from our students, collated via the QAPL (Quality Assurance in Practice Learning) demonstrates the high quality social work placements that we provide along with fantastic Practice Educators:

• Final placement rated good or more: 95%

• Recommend their placement: 95%

Recommend their PE: 97%

# **NON DRIVING STUDENTS**

We are expecting to have a higher number of non driving (final year) student social workers for 25/26. Therefore we need all employer partners to continue to support placement opportunities for non driving students – reminder below of Employer Placement Commitment:

# Percentage (of expected placements offered to non drivers)

- LA/ Organisation with Large and strong transport infrastructures: Manchester
- Non driving placement target is 60% (Split between Children 30% and Adults 30%).
- LA/ Organisation with good transport infrastructures: Bury/ Oldham/ Rochdale/
  Salford/ Tameside/ Trafford
- Non driving placement target is 35% (Split between Children 17.5% and Adults 17.5%)
- LA/ Organisation with average transport infrastructures (lack tram): Bolton/ Stockport/ Wigan
- Non driving placement target is 20% (Split between Children 10% and Adults 10%)

# **Social Work Relational Leadership Programme**

Our 5 day programme designed and delivered by Ali Gardner (Director of Head, Heart and Hands in Practice) and Siobhan Maclean (Kirwin Maclean associates) was developed to support social work managers and leaders to embed relational approaches, develop positive relationships with teams when working change and complexity, and supporting the supervisory relationship with team members.

The Adult cohort started in May 2025 and concluded in September

# Highlights:

- 27 managers/ leaders completed the course
- 100% found the course beneficial to their leadership development needs

#### **Positive feedback Impacts:**

- Intervision & Supervision Models: Widely appreciated by the group and implemented in practice.
- **Reflection Techniques**: "Head, heart, hands" and "Stretchy square" were mentioned as valuable tools to take into practice.
- **Situational Leadership**: Recognised as a key takeaway for adapting leadership styles.
- **Identity & Values**: Reflection on personal and professional identity was impactful to the group.

The **Children and Families cohort** started in September with 30 managers/ leaders from across our GM local authorities enrolled, this cohort will run through to February 2026.

#### AI and Social Work

Following actions from our Governance Board, noting the increasing use of AI in social work, we have collaborated with Josh Behan- Delvin and Dr Pat Cartney at the University of Manchester to submit a UKRI Impact Accelerator Account (IAA) starter fund proposal.

Objectives of the proposal are to:

- Scope current practice arrangements for how AI tools in social work are currently used across GMSWA employers partners
- Develop and share understanding of the benefits and challenges of AI for employer partners
- Identify opportunities to strengthen social work practice and education in this area.
- Produce a report to consolidate and to disseminate locally held knowledge to wider stakeholders.

Our Governance Board have agreed to support the proposal and the engagement with employer partners to participate in online workshops.

We will share funding updates hopefully in November and workshops details will follow soon after. Please do support us by participating in this research.
